SOUTH DAKOTA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ANNOUNCES 2025-26 SEASON

Season to celebrate 30-year anniversary of Concertmaster Doosook Kim.

Classical highlights include Falla's Three Cornered Hat, Gershwin's An American in Paris,
Delights and Dances by Pulitzer Prize winning American composer Michael Abels, Beethoven's
Piano Concerto No. 3 with soloist Lio Kuok-Wai, Shostakovich's Symphony No. 8 with
background provided by cultural historian Joseph Horowitz, Haydn's oratorio "The Creation" in
collaboration with the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra Chorus,
and Mahler's Fifth Symphony.

Pops programs feature a screening of Alfred Hitchcock's classic horror film *Psycho* with unforgettable eerie score by Bernard Hermann, annual holiday celebration 'Tis the Season, and a salute to great Broadway musicals immortalized in film.

Sioux Falls, SD – Today the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra announced details of the 2025-26 season, its 104th, which will celebrate 30 years with Concertmaster Doosook Kim. Kim will take center stage as soloist for the Violin Concerto of Alban Berg in the final concert of the season (April 25, 2026).

The new season opens October 4 in the Washington Pavilion with a program featuring music of Latin America including Falla's enchanting Three-Cornered Hat and arias from Bizet's opera *Carmen*. Other highlights include masterworks of Duke Ellington, George Gershwin, and Chick Corea's Trombone Concerto performed by New York Philharmonic Principal Trombone Joesph Alessi (Nov. 22, 2025), the South Dakota premiere of Delights and Dances by Pulitzer Prize winning American composer Michael Abels (Jan. 24, 2026), Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 3 with soloist Lio Kuok-Wai (Feb. 7, 2026), Dmitri Shostakovich's Symphony No. 8 with

background provided by cultural historian and long-time SDSO collaborator Joseph Horowitz (Mar. 7, 2026), and Mahler's Fifth Symphony (Apr. 25, 2026). The South Dakota Symphony Orchestra Chorus will be featured in Handel's Messiah (Dec. 5 & 6, 2025) and Haydn's oratorio "The Creation" (Apr. 11, 2026). On Sunday, April 12, the SDSO will offer Concert For Kids & Families specifically tailored to introduce young listeners to the orchestra. Popular presentations include a screening of Alfred Hitchcock's classic horror film *Psycho* with the SDSO strings performing the spine-tingling score by Bernard Hermann, the annual celebration of the holidays – 'Tis the Season – and a salute to Broadway musicals that have also been immortalized in film.

"The new season is a mix of traditional and contemporary I think our audiences will enjoy," said SDSO Music Director Delta David Gier. "There is Beethoven and Gershwin and Mozart, but we also have a fascinating concerto for trombone – not a common solo instrument – by noted jazz artist Chick Corea and new works by Robert Carl, Jessica Meyer, and Michael Abels – three outstanding living American composers."
